Regulations

(Please note that entries submitted after this time will not be accepted)

PLEASE NOTE: NO PHOTOGRAPHY OF EXHIBITS ALLOWED BEFORE JUDGING HAS TAKEN PLACE.

- Exhibits must be staged between 9.30 am and 11 am on the day of the Show.
 Exhibitors are requested to stage exhibits as early as possible <u>but not before 9.30</u> and to leave hall as soon as exhibits have been placed.
- 2. The Society will provide vases for all exhibits. Please supply your own oasis.
- 3. All exhibitors are asked to label their exhibits, as far as possible, with the name of the variety. In close competition, the Judge will take this into consideration
- 4. All exhibits must be made in the name of a paid-up member of the Society (Except juniors under 14, who must be the child or grandchild of a paid-up member)
- 5. Exhibitors may only enter 1 entry in any class. Two or more persons may not compete separately in the same class with flowers from the same garden and/or allotment. If members of a household wish to share the credit and prizes, then the exhibits should be entered in joint names.
- 6. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor, who may have employed labour for rough work only. Mixed flowers are to be displayed loose in a vase and not as an arrangement.
- 7. Exhibits or Award cards must not be removed before the close of the Show Items not removed at the end of the Show will be disposed of by the Committee.
- 8. Judges' sheets must not be removed and remain the property of the GPHS in case of disputed awards.
- 9. The Committee, in consultation with the Judge, may withhold any award in any class, or make additional awards at their discretion.
- 10. The RHS Show Handbook will be used by the Judge as a guide and the decision of the Judge must be regarded as final.
- 11. Exhibitors to be responsible for placing and removing their own exhibits.
- 12. Any contingency arising, not provided for in these Regulations, shall be subject to the decision of the Committee.

NOTE:

Points and certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd place and highly commended at judges' discretion.

GPHS TRADING HUT Vouchers will be awarded for highest, second highest and third highest points in each category highest aggregate and Best in Class at judges' discretion.

Juniors will receive a small cash award for best in category.

COMPETITION CATEGORIES

SWEET PEAS:

Class:

- 1 A single Sweet Pea, any variety
- 2 A vase of 3 stems Gwendoline variety
- 3 A vase of 3 stems any variety
- 4 A vase of 5 stems Gwendoline variety
- 5 A vase of 5 stems, any variety
- 6 A vase of 9 stems, mixed varieties, two or more
- 7 Juniors (under 14 years of age) a vase of 3 stems, any variety (Sweet peas must be exhibited as stems without tendrils or foliage)

ROSES:

Class:

- 1 A single Rose, one stem, single bloom any colour no extra buds
- 2 Three stems, single bloom, one variety, one colour no extra buds
- 3 Three stems, single bloom, any variety/type, any colour, no extra buds
- 4 Floribunda, one main stem with cluster, any variety/type, any colour no extra buds
- 5 Floribunda, three stems, one variety, one colour, no extra buds
- 6 5 stems, any variety/type, any colour, no extra buds
- 7 Climbers, three stems climbing roses, one variety/type, one colour (Roses are exhibited with foliage but no extra buds)

PEONIES:

Class:

- 1 1 stem, any variety or colour
- 2 3 stems, any variety, or colour
- 3 3 stems, one variety, one colour

(Peonies are exhibited as stems with foliage attached)

MIXED FLOWERS:

1 Vase of any mixed flowers, any variety, any quantity.(With or without foliage)Flowers must have been grown by the exhibitor

POTTED PLANTS:

Class:

- 1 Flowering plant in pot (Plant must have been in the pot for at least 6 weeks. Pot not to exceed 18cm (7inches) in diameter)
- 2 Foliage plant in pot (Plant must have been in the pot for at least 6 weeks. Pot not to exceed 18cm (7inches) in diameter)
- 3 Cactus or succulent (Specimen plant pot not to exceed 30cm (12 inches) in diameter.)
