SUMMER FLOWER SHOW

Regulations

1. Entry forms must be emailed to sheila@gphs.org.uk as early as possible but not later than 6 pm on Thursday 2 July or handed in at the Trading Hut by the preceding Sunday. Entries submitted after this time will not be accepted.

All exhibits must be staged between 9.30 am and 11.30 am on the day of the Show.

Exhibitors are requested to stage exhibits as early as possible and to leave the hall as soon as exhibits are in place.

Exhibitors must not move exhibits which have already been staged. If an exhibit needs to be moved to provide more space, please ask a steward for assistance.
2. The Society will provide vases for all exhibits which must be used. Please supply your own oasis (floral foam). Vases available in advance on request.
3. All exhibitors are asked to label their exhibits, as far as possible, with the name of the variety. Correct, clear labelling may be an advantage in close competition.
4. All exhibits must be made in the name of a paid-up member of the Society.
(Except juniors under 14, who must be the child or grandchild of a paid-up member.)
5. Exhibitors may only enter 1 entry in any class. Two or more persons may not compete separately in the same class with flowers from the same garden and/or allotment. If members of a household wish to share the credit and prizes, then the exhibits should be entered in joint names.
6. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor, who may have employed labour for rough work only.
7. Exhibit cards and Award cards must not be removed before the close of the Show.
8. Judge's sheets must not be removed and remain the property of the GPHS in case of disputed awards.
9. The Society, in consultation with the Judge, may withhold any award in any class, or make additional awards at their discretion.
10. The RHS Show Handbook will be used by the Judge as a guide and the decision of the Judge must be regarded as final.
11. Exhibitors are responsible for placing and removing their own exhibits. **Exhibitors must remove their exhibits at the end of the show to enable the hall to be left in a clean state.**
12. Any contingency not provided for in these Regulations shall be subject to the decision of the Society.
